Location


[Collaborations Workshop 2026](#) (CW26) will take place as a hybrid event from Tuesday 28 April to Thursday 30 April 2026 at [ICC Belfast](#).

Getting to Belfast

Belfast is easy to get to, with Belfast and Dublin offering 179 direct European routes and 245 internationally. There are 21 direct UK flight routes to Belfast, as well as ample train and ferry options.

By Public Transportation

By Ferry

To get to Belfast by ferry from Scotland, you will need to take a ferry from Cairnryan, located in southwest Scotland, to Belfast. The most popular and direct route is operated by Stena Line, with the journey taking approximately 2 hours and 15 minutes.

To get to Belfast by Ferry from England, you will need to take a ferry from Liverpool.

By Bus

Coaches operate from London to Belfast daily on the 920 service, departing at 18.00, 22.30 and 23.00.

London Victoria Coach Station is just 300 metres from the tube network, and is served by the Victoria Line, the District Line, and the Circle line. A bus stop is based outside the station, and there is a taxi rank outside the coach station on Eccleston Place.

There are many [places to park](#) in Belfast city centre and around ICC Belfast.

By Air

The two main airports serving Belfast are George Best Belfast City Airport (BHD), which is located close to the city center, and Belfast International Airport (BFS), a larger airport situated further out.

The Airport Express 300 bus service runs from Belfast International Airport to the city centre, stopping at Grand Central Station, and other key locations along the way. The journey takes around 40 minutes. Tickets can be purchased at the bus stop from a ticket machine, from the driver, or online.

Similarly, Belfast City Airport has a designated Airport Express 600 Service which buses passengers every 20 minutes during peak times from the front of the terminal.

Accommodation

Belfast is a safe and walkable city with all major city centre hotels within 5-10 minutes walking distance from the city centre, ICC Belfast, venues and attractions.

Hilton Belfast is holding 50 bedrooms for delegates to book online, via their [website](#) for the preferential rate agreed of £159 per night, based on a minimum length of stay of 3 nights.

- Guests will be welcome to stay less however won't be able to avail of this rate
- Dates can be adjusted at the top of the site, by clicking "**edit stay**"
- Credit card details will be taken at the time of booking, however it is **pay on arrival**
- Free cancellation policy is 28 days prior to arrival
- The booking link will expire on the 28 March

Hybrid participation

Hybrid participation will be facilitated using Zoom. All participants - both remote and in-person - will need to install their client, and make sure that it is updated to the latest version. We recommend that remote participants join with a good quality headset with microphone, plenty of screen space (either using a large monitor or second screen), a

normally reliable WiFi signal or wired connection, and a quiet room where you are less likely to be disturbed (but we understand this might be difficult).

Transcription and captioning will be provided using Zoom and Otter.ai.

A CW26 Slack workspace will be available for participants to connect, engage in discussion, ask questions, and forge new collaborations. These conversations can persist long after the Zoom room has closed.
