Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988




Software Directive (2009/24/EC)










Open Source Software (OSS) Licences Spectrum







OSS Licences Top 10 most common



Rank	License	%
1.	MIT License	26%
2.	GNU General Public License (GPL) 2.0	21%
3.	Apache License 2.0	16%
4.	GNU General Public License (GPL) 3.0	9%
5.	BSD License 2.0 (3-clause, New or Revised) License	6%
6.	GNU Lesser General Public License (LGPL) 2.1	4%
7.	Artistic License (Perl)	4%
8.	GNU Lesser General Public License (LGPL) 3.0	2%
9.	Microsoft Public License	2%
10.	Eclipse Public License (EPL)	2%





OSS Licences Developer's Liability Overview (Examples)



Apache 2.0

Sections 7 and 8: The OSS is provided "as is" without any warranties or conditions of any kind. A wide disclaimer of liability liability for any losses incurred by the licensee. **Section 9:** A licensor may charge a fee to accept certain liabilities in respect of the OSS. In which case the licensor must indemnify all contributors to the OSS against any claims brought against them.



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Takeaways

- ✓ Software can protected by copyright.
- \checkmark Copyright protection is granted to eligible works upon their creation.
- ✓ Be mindful of who the copyright originates with.
- OSS must be licensed.
- ✓ Manage the OSS you use to avoid liability of copyright infringement.
- ✓ There is no such thing as "the best" OSS license. Choose a license which best suits your goals in each case!
